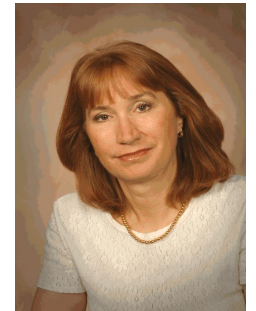

What Is An Otolaryngologist?

Otolaryngology (pronounced oh-toe-lair-in-goll-oh-jee) is the oldest medical specialty in the United States.

Otolaryngologists are physicians trained in the medical and surgical management and treatment of patients with diseases and disorders of the ear, nose, throat (ENT), and related structures of the head and neck.

They are commonly referred to as ENT physicians.

What do Otolaryngologists Treat?

Otology/Neurotology: diseases of the ear, including wax impaction, hearing loss, ear infections, perforated eardrums, ear noise (tinnitus) and balance disorders.

Pediatric Otolaryngology: evaluation and treatment of children including ear infections, hearing loss, adenoid and tonsil problems, tongue tie and allergy.

Head and Neck: cancerous and noncancerous tumors in the head and neck, including saliva glands, thyroid and some parathyroid.

Rhinology: disorders of the nose and sinuses, including nose bleeds, loss of smell, nasal obstruction, chronic sinus infections, allergies and septal deviation.

Laryngology: disorders of the lung and throat, including voice and swallowing problems.

Snoring and surgical treatment of OSA (obstructive sleep apnea).

Evaluation, testing and treatment of allergies: including allergy shots.

All of the above symptoms may be signs of allergies. Decreasing exposure to what you are allergic to and/or taking medicine may bring relief. When these measures fail or are undesirable, we offer screening allergy skin testing which can take as little as 20 minutes.

Comprehensive skin testing is another option which tests 30 common allergens. Based on these results, our allergy staff works closely with both doctors to determine the best course of therapy for each patient.
